READING ONE (OLD TESTAMENT): GENESIS 1: 1-5

Six Days of Creation and the Sabbath

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the

darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

READING TWO (NEW TESTAMENT): JOHN 3: 16—21

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."



CHURCH ROOF APPEAL



There has been a tremendous response to the Roof Appeal, and donations from the congregation and the community add up to very nearly £40,000. With fundraising events/activities and Gift Aid added the total comes to £50,700. As we have raised 50% of what we require, we are now in a position to apply to grant making bodies, although we must also continue with our own fundraising activities and ongoing donations. This is quite an achievement given the constraints of the last year. Particular thanks to those who delivered the leaflets throughout the village – the financial response received means it was well worth it.
